EUGENE POLICE CHIEF CHRIS SKINNER DISCUSSED THE CITY'S 2025 CRIME STATISTICS DURING A PRESS CONFERENCE ON FEBRUARY 19TH.

{VO} SKINNER SAYS CRIMINAL TRESPASSING REMAINS EUGENE'S MOST COMMON CRIME, UP FIFTY FOUR PERCENT FROM LAST YEAR. SEVERAL OTHER CATEGORIES DECLINED LIKE THEFT, VEHICLE THEFT, AND VANDALISM... BURGLARIES ALSO DROPPED MORE THAN THIRTY-ONE PERCENT...

OVERDOSES ARE DOWN TWENTY-FOUR PERCENT, REACHING A FOUR-YEAR LOW.
